

We've always used Budget to rent a Jeep. You can reserve from your puter and pick it up at the airport on STX. I seem to recall it helps to know your incoming flight number. Make sure you call your C/C and let them know you will be on island and plan to use the card for a rental. Once we land it usually takes around an hour





to get our luggage and Jeep rental. It's a small airport. Arriving STX is far different from departing. It's alive and fun. Taxis waiting. Cruzan serving rum at the baggage carousel. Budget will tag your C/C account for \$500 on a Jeep rental. And you must designate a driver or additional drivers. When you return the Jeep they balance out it's usually less than \$400 unless you purchase the refuel. We have made about eight trips to Stx in the last four years and we stay 2-3 weeks each time.- Except for one bad experience with Judi of St Croix we have always used Centerline! We get a cheap Yaris or similar and we've even gone up to Ridge to Reef Farm and that, my friends, is the road from heck! When we land Randy goes to the window and gets the keys and I wait for our one checked bag- in May of this year it took only 30 minutesnow here's my take on a jeep rental-local friends are telling us the pot holes are worse than ever - like the road to Butler Bay and of course Mahogany Rd- but that said, if you go slow and check things out you will be fine. I think younger folks and some older ones like Dionne enjoy that open air feeling of the jeep- but unless you have a hardtop there is no trunk to lock things up. The first time we came to Stx we rented one for a day and had a bumpy ride all day and took it back. The locals we know have the "new" potholes committed to memory so they can drive around at nightwe stay out late in Christiansted so we will be checking all our routes in daylight on our up coming three week stay in Januaryour property owner also said we did not need a jeep this time and

she has lived there all her life - she is not the only local that told us this! The money we have saved by not renting a jeep has paid for some mighty fine dinners at Savant, Galangal and Balter! You can book online with Centerline and you give them your CC and drivers license # and yes they will put a hold on your CC for \$500 as security- so all you do is go to the window get the keys and drive up and they check everything and we take pictures of it all around in case of problems- in May the car was new and had only 4000 miles and not a scratch on it. Our ins with USAA covers rentals in the USVI so we don't pay for additional ins from them- to sum this up I think everyone is there to have a good time and enjoy what the beautiful island of STX has to offer and so my advice is to rent a vehicle that suits your needs and personality makes you feel safe! Remember drive on the left! Lol
